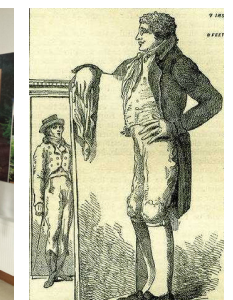
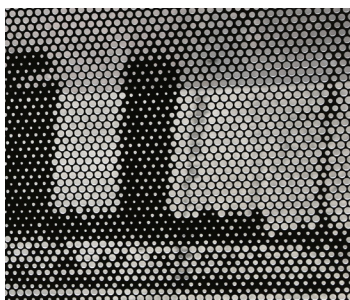


A Four Storey Office Foyer, Leeds. Incorporating images of the local landscape in this 61,000 sq ft. eye-catching building: The atrium lift wall features backlit current and historic images of the city and region, set behind perforated metal panels. When viewed closely, the images appear as abstract patterns, but from a distance the images of the local area are visible, connecting a global business to its immediate context.



A dedicatory **Picture-Perf** panel was unveiled on **Spike Island** to mark the Anniversary of the Handover of Cork Harbour Treaty Forts. The image chosen was that of the last soldiers leaving the island

An Beal Bocht, honoring Irish novelist Brian O' Nolan. Dressed in his iconic coat and Fedora hat, Perforated images on the bronze book covers come to life particularly when its gets dark. The LED lighting on the inside shines through the perforations creating vivid images of the book cover.



A striking coastal memorial to the victims of the doomed **Lusitania**, this unique metal piece was crafted using holes instead of ink to create a near-photographic image on metal. Located at Signal Tower on the Old Head of Kinsale.

A life-size replica of **Patrick Cotter-O'Brien** (1760-1806), 'The Giant of Kinsale', perforated in 2mm stainless steel, was recently presented to **The Kinsale Museum** by local engineering company Graepels. While alive, he stood approximately 8'1" tall.
